Warsaw July 2 nd, 2020

Dear LOT Partners,

we start sunny July with a good news - we have just announced the next stage of LOT's passenger network development.

From July, we resume our long-haul flights to Canada, South Korea, Japan, followed by short-haul flights to Great Britain, Albania, Montenegro and Ukraine.

From the beginning of July, our long-awaited international schedule will include long haul connections to:

- Toronto from July 1;
- Seoul from July 3;
- Tokyo (Narita) from July 3.

All long-haul flights will be operated from Warsaw Chopin Airport. In addition, from July 20 LOT will also resume the Budapest-Seoul connection. Tickets for long-haul flights are already available in all sales channels.

I would also like to share with you the first sales results. Despite the pandemic restrictions all over the world, the #SummerwithLOT - our biggest summer campaign was truly awaited by passengers. Within a week of introducing the new holiday destinations to the booking system, we have already sold over 130,000 seats to individual passengers and tour operators.

Seeing the longing of our passengers for travels with LOT, we do not slow down, and from July also four short-haul destinations will return to the timetable:

- London (London Heathrow airport);
- Tirana connection available from July 4 from Warsaw and from July 5 from Gdansk and Katowice;
- Montenegro Warsaw-Podgorica and Warsaw-Tivat connections will be available from July 4. From July 9, also the Poznań-Podgorica connection;
- Ukraine from 1 July Warsaw Kiev/Boryspil and from 15 July Warsaw Odessa.

At the same time, we kindly ask you to remind passengers that due to the unstable epidemic situation, before buying a ticket, passengers are obliged to check the documents and procedures required to cross the border of the country they intend to go to. These regulations are subject to change and the carrier may not take passengers who have not completed the required formalities before their trip.

Currently, entry restrictions apply to, among others, Cyprus - where a negative coronavirus test result is required, carried out up to 72 hours before departure and Greece - where travelers has to register at www.travel.gov.gr and fill a special declaration at least 48 hours before departure.

Information on current safety procedures and applicable entry restrictions can be found on the websites of the IATA International Air Transport Association, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, country-specific Embassies, Consulates and respective Ministries of Health. In addition, due to epidemic reasons, some countries still allow entry only for their citizens and persons entitled to do so, including Canada.



Finally, I would like to briefly summarize our current LOT announcements on the resumption of passenger flights. I am glad that LOT passengers can already benefit from the offer of about 250 flights a week. Only a few weeks after the resumption of passenger connections, we can initiate restoring almost 70% of destinations planned for 2020, including number of international connections. Achieving the goal of providing our passengers with the opportunity to travel safely and comfortably with LOT wouldn't have been possible without your increased work and trust.
