

Temporary suspension of entry of persons from the United Kingdom and South Africa to Panama

The Ministry of Health of the Republic of Panama, announced through Resolution No. 1390 of December 21, 2020 that as of 11:59 p.m. on December 21, 2020:

- The entry into the national territory of persons who have stayed in or transited through the United Kingdom and the Republic of South Africa in the last 20 days before their entry into the country, whether by air, land or sea, using commercial or private means, is temporarily suspended.
- Panamanian citizens and foreign residents entering the country must undergo a PCR or antigen test upon arrival. Regardless of the result, they will be quarantined in a hotel hospital for the time determined by the health authorities, in order to verify that they are not infected with the new SARS-CoV-2 strain (COVID-19).

Passengers who require may request changes, re-accommodation or leave the ticket open in accordance with existing exemptions for voluntary changes:

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
