



LATAM Airlines announces a new direct route between Munich and Sao Paulo from June 2019

Tickets for the route, which makes the airline's ninth connection between Europe and Latin America, are now available for purchase at latam.com and through travel agents.

London, 29th November, 2018 - LATAM Airlines Group has launched the sale of tickets for the new Europe to Latin America route, joining the German city of Munich with Sao Paulo, commencing flights on 26th June 2019.

The new route will operate four times a week on a Boeing 767-300 aircraft, with a capacity of 191 in Economy and 30 in Premium Business class. With this new flight, LATAM Airlines strengthens its position in Europe as the 'go to airline' for connections between principal European and Latin American capitals. Munich becomes the ninth connection between the two continents and the second in Germany, after Frankfurt.

Rodrigo Contreras Brain, Director General of LATAM Airlines in Europa comments that, "We are the leading company connecting Europe with Latin America, offering flight routes to more than 120 destinations, and with the best network to travel throughout South America, no other airline offers our extensive connections nor such a great variety of flights and schedules."

The four weekly flights will operate on Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday on flight number LA8213, departing Munich at 8.15 P.M. local time and arriving in Sao Paulo at 4.35 A.M. local time the following morning, with a total flight time of 13 hours and 20 minutes.

From Sao Paulo, the flights return on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday on LA8212, departing at 11.25 P.M. local time from Guarulhos Airport and arriving at Franz Josef Strauss in Munich at 5.15 P.M. the following afternoon, making a total journey time of 12 hours and 50 minutes.





LATAM's international expansion

LATAM Airlines Group continues to strengthen its international network, as well as within Latin America. In 2018, the airline announced the opening of 18 new international destinations, including Las Vegas, Rome and Boston and Tel Aviv, bringing the network's reach to a total of 143 destinations in 26 countries
