Bye, Bye eFix

Effective October 1, eFix will be decommissioned and all onboard feedback will be submitted through the handheld device.

The reporting feedback feature (in the Post-Sales section) will be easier, more convenient and quicker to use.

New Tomato Juice Format

Effective October 1, and on a progressive basis, *Heinz* tomato juice cans will be replaced by one litre tetra packs of *Sunberry* tomato juice. Shake well before serving to ensure maximum flavour.

PWNA in globe Briefing Package

Customers with a severe peanut/nut allergy (PWNA) who have requested a buffer zone prior to flight will now be identified in the globe Briefing Package, thereby giving cabin crew advance notice of these requests.

The names, seat numbers and corresponding SSR code will be indicated in the Detailed Passenger List, which is available as a selectable option under Passenger Summary.

Accommodating Musical Instruments as Cabin Baggage

Passengers travelling with a musical instrument as carry-on are now permitted to board during pre-boarding between zones 2 and 3, at the same time as families with children under the age of six or those that need more time to board the aircraft.

Customers who have purchased an extra seat for their musical instrument are still allowed to board first, in order to allow for sufficient time to secure their instrument. Any customer who is entitled to Priority Boarding in zones 1 or 2 may continue to do so, even if travelling with a musical instrument as carry-on.

As per *Publication 356*, cabin crew are required to monitor overhead bins to maximize space utilization and to assist passengers in finding room for their cabin baggage. If cabin crew are unable to find a suitable stowage space in the overhead bins, the passenger's musical instrument may be stowed in the closet, if required.

Business Class – Breakfast à la Carte

As of October 1, the following catering changes will be introduced to North America Business Class. The primary changes are adjustments to meal choices as well as a new selection of packaged snacks.

- two meal choices will be offered on medium/long-haul lunch/dinner flights (instead of 3):
 → no changes to premium long-haul flights.
- whole wheat and white bread will be provisioned on all flights, including breakfast:
 → cinnamon bread will be removed from the morning bread selection.
- refreshed selection of snack basket products:
 - → Miss Vickie's chips Lindt 70% chocolate KitKat chocolate roasted almonds
 - → and also Biscoff cookies MadeGood apple cinnamon bars for short-haul flights (20:00 to 04:59)

Trash Compactor Boxes – Update

There is an issue with the latest supply of trash compactor boxes we received. It has been recently reported on numerous occasions that the boxes are breaking during compacting. The supplier of the boxes is aware of the situation and is working on a fix.

As a temporary measure, Flex-e-Bags are being provisioned on all aircraft equipped with trash compactors. Flex-e-Bags are garbage bags designed for use in half-size carts that can be snapped closed when full.

The Flex meal remains an option for customers wishing to dine later during the flight. As per current specs, it consists of a hot main course (galley plated), warm bread, salad, cheese & fruit.

A321 Cabin Crew Complement – October

In accordance with the Collective Agreement, the crew complement on the A321 is five for 50% of the A321 fleet's flying hours. The blocks will indicate four or five, depending on the month. For October, the A321 will be blocked at five.

787 Dimmable Windows

To reduce the use of auxiliary power units, thereby minimizing our fuel expense costs, the following procedure will be implemented on all flights operated by the 787, effective October 1.

Upon arrival, set window dimming to level **5** (darkest) once all customers have deplaned and prior to leaving the aircraft. As per current SOP's, dimmable windows must be set at **1** (lightest) prior to passenger boarding.

In addition to saving energy, this procedure keeps the cabin temperature comfortable while the aircraft is on the ground and helps the environment.

A319 JETZ

A319 fins 275, 280 and 282 are now dedicated to JETZ and feature a 58J cabin configuration.

As iPads are used on JETZ flights, there's an iPad carrier (with a **Do Not Remove** placard on it) in the AFT galley that must always remain on the aircraft, even when it operates mainline flights.

Important! These iPads are not to be used on mainline flights.

E190 – Status

From October 2015 to April 2016, 20 E190 aircraft will be leaving the Air Canada fleet at a rate of approximately two to three fins per month. A total of 25 E190's, all equipped with GoGo Wi-Fi, are scheduled to remain in our fleet.

Diaper Disposal

There has been a recent increase in the number of blocked lavatories due to the improper disposal of diapers. These situations are not only a great inconvenience to our customers but also very costly to repair.

When completing the safety briefing for customers travelling with an infant, provide a diaper disposal bag to parents traveling with infants and remind them to dispose the bag in the lavatory garbage bin. Return unused bags to the flight satchel or dry food unit carrier.
